

Update on Essex Green Skills Plan and Summit

Update for EDG Aug 2023

Our definition of Green Skills*

Green skills are knowledge, experience, values, attitudes and abilities that support carbon reduction and resource efficiency to increase climate resilience and enhance natural assets.

Green skills do not form their own sector, they are relevant to all sectors in the economy.

The transition to a net zero and sustainable economy has differing impacts on jobs. These impacts can be classified as:

- **A. New and emerging green skilled jobs:** Creation of new occupations with unique tasks that are considered directly green e.g. electric vehicle designers and manufacturers.
- **B. Enhanced green skilled jobs:** Significantly altered tasks, skills and knowledge requirements e.g. mechanics upskilling in electric vehicle maintenance.
- **C. Increased demand green skilled jobs:** Increased demand for existing occupations, however, no significant changes in the work and worker skills e.g. electrical engineers & power line installers to supply low carbon electricity for EV charging.

Interim Green Skills Action - Background

Our Challenge

- Our Priorities
- Levelling Up Maximise green skills and employment opportunities as we develop Essex as a centre for innovation, supporting new technologies and business models to enable our economy to transition to net zero and secure green jobs for the future - <u>Everyone's Essex – Our Plan for levelling up</u> <u>the county</u>
- Delivery and Intervention Support the delivery of skills interventions that prepare the county for future jobs. In total, Essex will require 15,908 green jobs by 2030, and 27,741 by 2050 – LGA Report – Accelerating a sustainable economic recovery for Essex. It is crucial that there is a workforce in place to deliver the change needed by 2030 and 2050.
- Skills Gaps Identify skills shortage areas and support Essex employers and residents in upskilling and reskilling so that businesses and individuals understand the opportunities that green skills present to them. For example, We estimate up to 12,800 retrofit jobs for Essex by 2030 - <u>Essex Sector</u> Development Strategy

- Raise awareness and improve access to green skills information for our residents and learners, including carbon literacy, accreditation schemes and job opportunities.
- Coordinate with our training providers and support the resourcing of bespoke interventions to support the green skills needs of infrastructure projects and specific priority areas, sectors and localities via courses, CPD and business engagement.
- Improve businesses engagement and access to accreditation opportunities and other resources in order to support Essex's green skills ambitions and sustainability agenda.
- Facilitate collaboration and partnership, especially with Anchor institutions, in order to support and deliver our green skills ambitions, including Social Value processes in procurement.
- Address the shortage of teaching staff with the credentials, experience and interest in delivering green skills

What we have done thus far (pre-2023)

- We launched <u>Everyone's Essex</u> our plan for Levelling Up the County including our commitment to Green Growth.
- We have published the <u>Essex Green Skills Infrastructure</u> <u>review 2022</u> with recommendations that now form part of this Action Plan.
- We have invested in the <u>Essex Opportunities Portal</u> as a one stop shop for information and advice on jobs, careers, skills and training.
- Our Essex Sector Development Strategy highlights the opportunity for jobs in five key growth sectors, including Clean Energy and Construction and Retrofit. We have also trained over 200 residents as part of a UKCRF Retrofit programme.
- We have set up the <u>Essex Net Zero Innovation Network</u> to develop pioneering sustainability projects and decarbonisation solutions.
- The Essex Climate Action Commission published a <u>Final</u>
 <u>Report</u> with skills recommendations.
- We published the <u>Essex Climate Action Business Advice Pack</u> and the <u>Essex Climate Action Schools' Advice Pack</u>

- We had presentations from Freeport East, RWE, Colchester Institute, and STC Next (Port and Shipping sector training provider, Netherlands).
- Cllr Wagland chaired a panel discussion focusing on:
 - How can employers ensure that green skills are aligned with industry needs.....
 - How can educational institutions effectively integrate green skills into their curriculum...
 - How can we address the challenge of creating awareness and promoting the value of green skills among the general population in Essex?
 - How can we ensure that Essex residents, including disadvantaged communities and marginalised groups, have equal access to green skills training and employment opportunities...




Green Skills Summit -Attendees and feedback

Attendees were from a wide range to organisations.

Excluding staff, we had **71 in-person attendees and 22** virtual attendees

- 30 reps from Essex employers
- 24 from Training Providers
- 15 from LAs
- 7 from CEIAG /Youth organisations
- 17 other public sector (NHS, DWP etc).
- 80% of the attendees said they found the event extremely useful, and 20% found it useful.

100% of the respondents said they would be interested in attending a future Essex Green Skills Summit and suggested various themes for the next summit.
