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POST EVENT REPORT 2023

OVERVIEW

The 2023 Essex Housing Awards (EHA) in association with Birketts recognised the high-quality developments, services and individuals from the public, private and voluntary sectors promoting best practice across the county.

The third annual housing awards, organised in partnership with Essex Developers Group (EDG) and South Essex Housing Group (SEHG), built on the success of the past two programmes in 2019 and 2022.

Launching online on 18 April 2023, the 12 free-to-enter awards categories invited applications from across Essex County. Categories focused on developments of any size, design, partnership projects, climate action, skills, meeting housing need and much more. This included the addition of four new updated / new categories.

With the entry deadline closing Friday 7 July and the judging panel meeting late-July, the shortlist was announced on Tuesday 1 August.

Shortlisted applicants were invited to the Awards Ceremony which took place on Thursday 2 November, and was hosted once again, by News Broadcaster, Mark Easton and held at Greenwoods Hotel & Spa.

More than 170 guests enjoyed the drinks reception sponsored by Rentplus, networking opportunities and the 2-course buffet meal. The high point was the announcement of the award winners and presentation of the trophies.

The 2023 programme had a number of exciting new aspects. The aim of these was to improve upon the previous year, and to add value to partners, sponsors, and supporters.

Since the launch of the 2023 Essex Housing Awards in April, social media content on LinkedIn and Twitter has generated more than 32,000 organic impressions and more than **1,250 page engagements** across the campaign timeframe.
